## **Wharf Project Town Hall**

New Museum Exhibit Treasure Cove Events Community Meetings Latest Council Action Upcoming Council Items On Wednesday, February 21, City staff and business owners joined together for a town hall meeting to discuss the Wharf Project and the unfortunate, but necessary, demolition of the two wharf buildings that historically housed the Wharf House Restaurant and the Boat and Bait Shop. This meeting was the first step in a much longer public visioning process about future structures on the wharf that will take place as the wharf resiliency project is completed.

City staff appreciated the opportunity to present current Wharf Project progress and to explain the extent of the damage to the two wharf structures. After inspections by the City Engineer, the Building Official, and a third party engineer, all the experts agreed that the buildings must be demolished rather than repaired due to safety, code, and financial concerns. At the town hall meeting the community made it clear that the services provided by the Wharf House Restaurant and the Boat and Bait Shop are highly valued and loved by Capitola.



### **New Historical Museum Exhibit**

On Saturday, March 16, the Capitola Historical Museum will premiere its 2024 exhibition, "Little City Under Canvas" - The 150th Anniversary of Camp Capitola. Nestled within Monterey Bay, this yellow stretch of beach at the mouth of Soquel Creek, bracketed by high fossil-laden cliffs, became one of California's first beach resorts. According to the Santa Cruz Surf, Camp Capitola was "... [t]he oldest camping ground on the Pacific Coast."

Officially opened on June 18, 1874, by Samuel Alonzo Hall, Camp Capitola was inspired by the 18th century British seaside resort model imported to America. Our 2024 exhibition recounts the history of the seaside resort idea, how it evolved to meet American needs and tastes, and in what ways Camp Capitola followed, and in what ways it diverged from those first "modern" seaside resorts.

Starting March 16th the admission free Capitola Historical Museum will be open Friday through Sunday, noon to 4:00 p.m.



### **Latest Council Action**

The following is a summarized list of the action taken by City Council during the agenda of the **Thursday**, **February 22**, **2024**, City Council meeting:

#### **General Government:**

- 1) Wharf Resiliency and Public Access Project Change Order continued voting on this item to a special meeting on Tuesday, February 27 at 4 P.M.
- 2) Bay Avenue & Hill Street Traffic Safety Updates Council authorized the construction of the recommended quick-build project to increase pedestrian and bicycle safety at this intersection; additional project elements will include increased road paint to highlight the bike lane and the potential for a second street light.
- 3) Zone 5 Drainage Master Plan Update Representatives from Schaaf and Wheeler, Consulting Civil Engineers, presented an overview of regional storm drain facilities within Zone 5.
- **4) Special Event and Park Process** continued to the next regular City Council meeting on March 14, 2024.
- 5) FY 2023-24 Mid-Year Budget Report Adopted a resolution amending the budget to include
- 6) 2023-24 CDBG Grant Application Council authorized staff to apply for a \$3.3.million grant for the Jade Street Community Center project.
